What does your volunteer involvement mean?

- From October 2021 until the beginning of June 2022
- Between 3 and 8 hours of volunteering per week, with longer periods approaching the festival
- Meetings with students from different universities and non-student volunteers
- The opportunity to bring the festival and visual anthropology within and outside your university ...
- Frequent, friendly FIFEQ meetings ... maybe face-to-face soon!

What volunteer positions are to be filled?

General coordination: 1 to 2 volunteers needed to ensure with leadership and empathy the coordination and support of volunteers in their various tasks, ensure funding requests outside universities, answer questions and requests from directors and producers, support links with regular partners, plan the festival and team meetings and follow the budget. (around 8h / week / volunteer)

Programming committee: 8 to 10 volunteers needed to ensure the viewing and selection of submitted films, the ideation of the regular programming (thematic blocks from the selected films, discussions / round tables, invitation of university experts, from cinema, cultural and community circles, etc.). (around 3 to 5 hours / week / volunteer)

Special events committee: 4 volunteers needed to ensure the planning and organization of special events, for example: retrospective before the festival, special indigenous evening, etc.;

round tables / discussions, invitation of experts and other stakeholders. (around 3 to 5 hours / week / volunteer)

Communications / Promotion Committee: 5 volunteers needed

- 4 volunteers to ensure the communication plan and feed the various social networks of FIFEQ-MTL: FB, Instagram; write and update the website, develop communication partnerships with other festivals and cultural organizations, liaise with the graphic designer for visuals (around 3 to 5 hours / week / volunteer)
- 1 volunteer responsible for media relations: develop two media partnerships and ensure the distribution of the press release (approximately 2 hours / week / volunteer)

The Festival International du Film Ethnographique du Québec (FIFEQ) was born in 2003 at the initiative of a group of visual anthropology students from the University of Montreal. This one-of-a-kind festival, free to the public, is one of the rare platforms for the diffusion and promotion of ethnographic cinema in Canada. Thanks to the generous voluntary involvement of hundreds of students from Concordia, McGill and UdeM universities and many partners, the Festival has gathered for sixteen years several thousand spectators driven by a passion for cinema, visual anthropology, or simply by the curiosity to discover original films of the ethnographic genre.
